From BCCA Beautification Committee Chair, Betty Woods

Greetings good neighbors, I certainly hope all is going well and that you are contented, healthy and happy. If you notice, summer is gradually getting ready to fade into the background as fall gets ready to make its appearance. I want to give you some tips on trees that hopefully, will prevent you from having a problem I've had.

On Friday morning, I was in bed watching TV, when a massive oak tree in my neighbor's yard uprooted and fell on my house, destroying my shed, a large portion of my deck and landed on my roof right across my bedroom. Had a huge limb not impaled the ground breaking the impact of the weight, my roof would have been crushed and so would I. God is good!

Please inspect your trees. If the tree is not flowering and healthy, it might have root rot. If you notice wilting yellowing leaves, dying brown leaves and needles, mold or fuzzy patches or if the tree is leaning, these are indicators that the tree is unhealthy or diseased. Seeds are carried by wind, rain and animals resulting in unwanted tree growth. It doesn't take long for roots to get established and the tree grows quickly.

Please be considerate of your neighbors. When limbs encroach the neighbor's property, and/or straddles a fence (which is what happened in my case), take responsibility and remove them. We want the golden rule to apply to others, just as it's applied to us. Be kind and considerate; check on your neighbors from time to time, especially in rough weather. I thank God for the two neighbors who ran over to check on me.

Enjoy the remainder of your summer. Stay safe and considerate. Blessings. (Psalm 34:8)



Problem Statement

Lack of Involvement in Birchwood Association Activities

Over several years, participation in BCCA community activities, meetings, and events has decreased. Attendance at monthly meetings has decreased, and fewer residents are volunteering for committees or events. This lack of involvement is impacting our ability to address the many community issues that we are faced with such as:

- > 1. Traffic control for vehicles
- > 2. Litter in our neighborhood; poorly maintained common areas
- > 3. Safety concerns in neighborhood and park
- > 4. Decreasing membership, fewer community events
- > 5. Communication differences with various demographic groups (Spanish speakers from the Latino community)

Resulting in a lack of interpersonal connections among residents and less perspectives in decision making.



Problem: Decreasing membership of former members and need to increase membership of new members

What are the causes you can think of that contribute to decreasing BCCA membership or lack of increase of new members?

Causes

- -Non-English speakers feeling not connected
- Folks not feeling invested in the community
- Not knowing your neighbors (especially new folks in the community)
- -Lack of trust among perhaps undocumented neighbors
- Lack of communication in familiar language
- Other priorities (busy work, caretaking of elders and children)
- When the meetings are scheduled (always have hybrid meetings?)
- -Lack of follow-up with new members (no one talked to them)

Solutions

- -During community meetings, have childcare available
- -Having Spanish and English-speaking classes at the community center
- -Translate meetings from English into other language
- -Give youth community hours for participating in meetings/events
- -Create marketing that appeals to different audiences on various platforms (Wanda)
- -Block/Community/Diversity party—break into streets (with nametags) in different seasons
- -Invite Latino members to play Latin music at events (being aware of hours and respect)
- -Have heritage/cultural celebrations (like Cinco de Mayo or R&B party or call it Birchwood International Day or Birchwood Festival Day)
- -Neighbors advertise their businesses in community newsletter (Wanda offers free notary services for seniors over 65 years old)
- -Make in-person meetings also streamed with Zoom
- -Record in-person meetings
- -More hands for Gloria (chair of membership); more hands for the welcoming committee (the chair is empty)
- -Send letters, birthday wishes (possibly automate this)
- -Newsletter is in English and Spanish & meetings can have subtitles if streamed/recorded
- -The kids are Latino so go to their schools and go to their social media apps and go the parents and contact the Parent Teacher Association (PTA)—ask the PTA for ideas.
- -Let people know community meetings integrate problem solving into it.
